1 Resolution on Public Attendance.

8 Llyn Coron Update

- Cllr Elwyn Evans met with a member of Ynys Mon Council Highways Department on 15th March. Cllr Evans was pleased to be able to report that the hole had been attended to and tarmac was being laid. The road was now open to the public. The signage would be cleared away asap.
- The subsidence was a bigger issue and still needed to be resolved.
- Cllr Evans and the Highways representative also discussed the issue of the spring running into a pond at the side of the road. Pictures were taken. Awaiting response.

9 Community Mapping

- A ZOOM meeting is being set up and Cllr K Woods, Cllr C Topps and the Clerk will be following this through.

10 Donations

- Macmillan request for assistance with funding. The Charity funding has taken a shortfall due to lockdown restrictions.

CGT Proposed £200, Seconded AH, voting was unanimous.

11 Planning Applications

- Planning has been granted on Full application for the conversion of existing laundry building into a self contained holiday accommodation together with alterations and extensions at Canolfan Llety /Accommodation Centre, Llys Llewelyn, Stryd y Capel/Chapel Street, Aberffraw
- Planning has been refused on Planning Consultation D56/2021/1 - Prior approval for the installation of Telecommunications equipment at Bwlan, Aberffraw

12 Correspondence

• Litter / Dog Poop etc.,

The Clerk received an email from a member of the community concerned with the amount of litter, dog poop and poop bags being left around the village and the surrounding areas.

- The Welsh Assembly has a Spring Clean Cymru initiative commencing 28th May to 13 June.

Action: The Clerk is to contact One Voice Wales and Ynys Mon Council for support with this initiative.

- CGT informed the CC that Mr, Mrs Ibbotson, and Miss R Morris do a fantastic job at weekends clearing up the litter etc. left on the Beach and Estuary areas.

Action: The Clerk to write a thank you letter to all.

- CGT suggested the Football Club may be able to offer support in a clean-up initiative. **Action: The Clerk to contact**

• Car Park

Cllr Evans highlighted an issue with visitors using the car park at the Dunes. Previously there was an initiative to extend the space between the old and new bridge by levelling the ground and placing agricultural soil there. The CC did obtain a grant for agricultural soil for paths etc., and this is ready for call off.

Action: Clerk to chase up the call off and report back.

• Resident Parking

CGT mentioned the increase in Parking Signs on people's walls to restrict visitor parking. CGT proposed contacting Ynys Mon Council regarding permits for residents. This was declined by Ynys Mon Council last year. Seconded by KW

Action: The Clerk to again contact the council regarding residents permits and the restriction of visitor parking in the village areas.

• Coastal Footpath

CGT stated that the coastal footpath was in a dreadful state and in some parts dangerous.

Action: The Clerk to contact the Footpath Officer.

13 Highways Issues

- Cllr W Hughes reported the electrical box at the side of the Lampost opposite Bragdy. Clerk has contacted Ynys Mon Council again. – **This has now been removed and made safe.**
- Cllr R F Owen requested the Clerk to find out details surrounding two gates that has been put in place on a footpath at the back of Penlon Cottage. These gates are now blocked with sand drifts after the high winds. It is believed that the gates are a combined initiative between the Bodorgan Estate and NRW.
Action – Clerk to contact both the Bodorgan Estate and NRW – **awaiting update**
